Community Outreach

Led by lain Hendry, our Community Outreach Manager, Uppingham's Outreach Programme gained momentum in 2023 and we were delighted to welcome the first pupil Vijay to join us with a fully funded place from September 2023.

The programme has established new pathways for young people to join the School. In alliance with our partner schools in the Mead Academy Trust we have engaged with over 100 young people from central Leicester through numerous outreach events including Sports Masterclasses, STEM Debates and Music Workshops.

"This engagement has inspired pupils from inner city Leicester to explore the possibility of an education at Uppingham - we have been able to offer funding for three Mead Trust pupils joining in September 2024."

"Before attending Uppingham, I went to English Martyrs Catholic School in Leicester. I was an active but timid member of school life, not fully aware of my capabilities and potential.

"My parents knew Uppingham was a place that carefully nurtured each pupil, helping them grow into wellrounded individuals. I was also curious about what lay beyond the walls of Leicester, and a fee-assisted place allowed me to experience much more than I had thought possible.

"My initial visit was filled with a mix of emotions. I was impressed by the mentor-like relationships between teachers and pupils, as well as the plethora of clubs and activities available for participation. However, I also felt a sense of apprehension knowing how different the environment was from what I was accustomed to. Nevertheless, upon arriving at New House, I immediately felt at home.

"What I cherished most about my time at Uppingham was the sense of community. Whether it was through sports or the spirited inter-house

competitions, I found an identity within the School. However, my biggest challenges stemmed from apparent barriers in thought and background.

"In spite of these challenges, my greatest achievement wasn't becoming School Captain; it was the small victories I experienced every day when I pushed myself out of my comfort zone. Each time I faced a situation that made me nervous, I grew a little bolder and more confident in myself. I wasn't just the girl from Leicester; I was the victrix ludorum, the short story winner, the chapel reader, the friend, the academic, and much more.

"Uppingham provided me with the opportunity to realise that attending an American university was within my reach. It shaped me into the embodiment of a Morehead-Cain Scholar: academically accomplished, athletically inclined, skilled, and committed to community service.

"My experience acclimatising at Uppingham prepared me for the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNC) where I serve as a DEI fellow in the University Office for Diversity and Inclusion. I am also a member of the boxing club, have been accepted into the Shuford Entrepreneurship Program, and have participated in undergraduate research in epidemiology.

"As advice for current pupils, I urge you to confront your fears and embrace new challenges. It is in those moments of fear and uncertainty, whether it's joining a new club or picking up a new sport or instrument, that you discover the incredible and capable person you truly are."

Ethan and Alanah joined Uppingham in the Lower Sixth from Frederick Gough School in Scunthorpe. Alanah had the following to say of her time at Uppingham.

"My brother applied after being recommended through rugby. After visiting, our family loved the School and everything that it had to offer, I knew immediately that Uppingham was where I wanted to go to and push myself.

"I was nervous before going to Uppingham, however everyone was so welcoming. The School itself is just beautiful and every person I encountered was so inclusive. Going into The Lodge with all the new Lower Sixth girls made it much more comfortable to settle in as everyone was in the same boat and had moved away from home.

"I loved the amount of new people that I met, people that I wouldn't have come across had I not gone to Uppingham. It was just a whole different environment where people shared diverse interests. I also loved the amount of support that the School had to offer and that I was constantly

pushed out of my comfort zone which really developed my character.

"My biggest challenge was moving away from home and being away from my family for the first time. It was daunting but there was always something to distract me from feeling homesick for too long.

"My biggest achievement was becoming House Captain and Netball 1st VII Captain after only a year.

"I absolutely loved my time at Uppingham and if I could go back and do it again, I would. My advice would be to take every opportunity and push yourself out of your comfort zone, this will really develop you as a person and it's a once in a lifetime opportunity.

"I am at Cardiff Metropolitan University and really enjoying my time, continuing with my netball. I feel as though Uppingham prepared me for university with moving away and developing my life skills."

Ethan and Alannah's father, Steve, describes the importance of the fee-assisted places to their family.

"Our son was awarded a Rugby Scholarship to Uppingham after being signposted via the Leicester Tigers Academy. Without the financial support, there was no chance of him being able to take such an amazing offer.

"We had no experience of boarding schools prior to this and were apprehensive of being separated from our son for such long periods. These concerns were removed once we understood the quality of the pastoral care that he received in our absence. All doubts were relieved to the extent

where only one year later we were supported by the School once more, to and indeed all the donations that have enable our daughter to attend. We had no hesitation in believing that this was the perfect place for her to develop and grow too. The academic support on offer was incredible, enabling both my children to achieve the highest A level marks possible and catapult their opportunities into university and their chosen sports. They matured rapidly in the social arena, learning valuable life skills in becoming House Captain and Praepostor, and 1st team Captains of Rugby and Netball.
